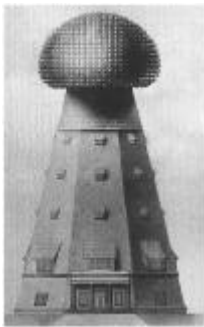

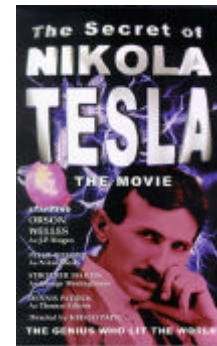

Why are we doing this? We are heading toward Penrose's tensor tetrad – spinor qu-bit connection, and with that, my post-quantum matter-mind connection between the explicate material universe of expanding accelerating 3D space and the implicate quantum Jungian collective unconscious mental information order of "pre-geometry" AKA "funda-MENTAL space" (Hameroff). We will also get to Shipov's construction of matter in the explicate order from the rotational torsion inertial tensor fields and how they, in turn, emerge from the implicate mental spinor order.
