Sunday, March 14, 2004 1 p.m.

Produced by Liberty International Entertainment, Inc., this series was so hot that it was taken off the air in the middle of its run last year on KCSM-60, a local PBS affiliate. JAY BALDWIN, presents "**The World of R. Buckminster Fuller**". Mr. Baldwin was a personal friend of Buckminster Fuller and is the author of "Bucky Works". He will endeavor to encapsulate core information about the life of Bucky Fuller, an extraordinarily inventive 20th century interdisciplinary scientist. Fuller's design science concepts have influenced the development of numerous areas of research as varied as economics and nanotechnology. His inventive contributions include the geodesic dome, the Dymaxion House, Tensegrity Modeling, World Dymaxion map, Synergetics, Dymaxion Car, World Game, Bucky Balls and more.
