MOHSEN HOURMANESH & JOSH SILVER, present "A Memorial Tribute to

Chuck Wallach". Mr. Wallach was the founder and C.E.O. of Bio Energy Services, Inc., the official U.S. distributor of the Paplmi wellness electronics device. The Paplmi device was originally invented in Greece by Professor P. T. Pappas and is based on Tesla technology. The Paplmi generates extremely brief intense magnetic bursts that import energy directly into cells as needed. It is currently in use by both the SF 49'ers and the Oakland Raiders to accelerate healing from sports injuries and it has an uncanny ability to accelerate plant growth.

Chuck Wallach spent many years in the Philippines developing successful protocols for the device's use in the effective treatment of many ailments. The company he has built has earned a well deserved reputation for quality and excellence. Proper integration of the Paplmi into U.S. health care could eventually have an extraordinary impact. Chuck exhibited outstanding leadership and dedication to the furtherance of wellness electronics via his development of the Paplmi device and his courageous farsighted support for mainstreaming wellness electronics. He quietly passed away on November 15, 2004

Mohsen Hourmanesh has known Mr. Wallach for at least 20 years and will share some information about Chuck and the Paplmi. PHILIP LANGTON presents " Smart Dust & Silicon Swarms: The Brilliant New World of Mobile Sensor Nanomesh Networks". Philip Langton's research could eventually lead to scalable nanomesh net applications such as: smart shipping labels that report damage, spray on computers or a robo-insect air force. How will smart dust particles talk to each other? What are the most likely nanomesh products to reach consumers soon? Might we see a computer in a can in 3 years? What are the costs and dangers? Mr. Langton has some fascinating answers. Philip Langton is a second-generation Silicon Valley engineer / inventor expert in Optical Frequency Identification

Devices (OFID), Micro-Electro-Mechanical Systems (MEMS) and process control manufacturing.
